



## SCHOOL RULES AND POLICIES

From August 28, 2012 to June 1, 2013

- There will be a 10% discount only for students who pay tuition for the entire year of classes before August 25, 2012.
- The four quarterly payments should be made by 9/2, 10/28, 2012, and 1/20, and 3/19, 2013 respectively.
- The tuition is not refundable. You can make up your missing classes during the same academic year or the session that you have paid. *Please see [tuition and materials fees via this link](#).*
- Please park 100 feet or more from 80 Springfield Drive during the classes in order to avoid traffic congestion and ensure safety. AAS prefers that parents park on Ocean Avenue..
- AAS regards the well-being of its students as primary. AAS implores parents to drop off and pick up their students at the agreed times since the studio is not staffed to supervise children outside of the instructional area and times.
- If a class or group has a special interest that demands an alteration in the content of the class, the teacher has the authority to change the requirements for class materials to adapt to such changes in course content.
- There will be field trips for landscape and architectural drawing or for other course work.
- During the Bridge Art Competition and the AAS annual exhibition, some classes will be moved to other days and times.
- The materials fee only covers basic classroom materials. Oil and painting classes will add an extra charge.
- Reference books will be shared in the classroom. They cannot be taken out of the school.
- Classroom instruction will end 5 minutes before the end of a 1-hour class and 10 minutes before the end of a 2-hour class. The exception is for those evening classes in which a tea break is incorporated into the class time.
- If a student cannot attend a scheduled class, he or she must notify the school at least 24 hours in advance in order to receive a credit toward a class at another date and time.
- Each month of instruction from October to May will be dedicated to an artist of historical importance. This practice will be given special attention in the basic classes.
